Emergency Procedures

This safety and emergency preparedness information is provided by the lowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management Division for State of lowa Capitol Complex employees. If you have any questions please contact your building supervisor or the Emergency Management Division at (515) 281-3231. State employees not located on the Capitol Complex should follow their department/office emergency plans.

Bomb Threat

Once a bomb threat has been received employees are asked to search their personal office space and report any suspicious packages or items to emergency officials. This search will aid emergency officials, due to employees being more familiar with their own work area and what would be considered out of place more so than an emergency responder.

Evacuation orders will be conveyed through the public address system or through personal notifications. Employees should take action as directed by emergency officials as to a safe location when evacuating. No one should try to re-enter the affected building until the "all clear" is announced.

A telephone threat checklist follows on page two.

If you receive a bomb threat, report it immediately to State Patrol at (515) 281-5608.

Fire

- 1. Close doors as you leave, to isolate the fire.
- 2. Walk do not run or hesitate.
- 3. Do not use elevators in evacuating.
- Supervisors with handicapped personnel will be responsible for their safe evacuation.
- Exit the building at the nearest exit away from the fire source.
- 6. All employees should know the location of their nearest fire extinguisher and how to operate it.

Do not delay evacuation in attempting to extinguish any uncontrollable fire.

7. Evacuees should remain in their designated assembly areas until emergency officials supply additional information.

If you discover a fire, go to the nearest fire alarm box and sound the alarm. Immediately call 911 and then State Patrol at (515) 281-5608.

Medical Emergency

Call 911 and then State Patrol at (515) 281-5608

Post employees at building entrances to direct medical personnel. Try to make the person comfortable and wait for emergency personnel to arrive.

Tornado

Upon notification via the public address system, or the NOAA weather radio report to your designated tornado shelter area.

Capitol Complex Tornado Shelter Areas

Capitol - Ground floor: corridors and the Capitol-Lucas tunnel.

Grimes - Basement and tunnel: central core between hallways on the 1st & 2nd floors.

Hoover - Level B and North half of Level A and the tunnel.

Jesse Parker - Refer to vocational rehabilitation center procedures manual.

Judicial - underground parking area.

Lucas - Basement and tunnel: area near elevators and restrooms (except 6th floor). Additional shelter in the stairwells.

Maintenance - restrooms.

New Historical - Basement hallways.

Ola Babcock Miller - West Hall, ground floor.

Wallace. 1st floor and tunnel: good protection in restrooms, conference rooms, and stairwells (except 5th floor).

Workforce Development.

South side: basement and tunnel. East wing: stairwells with no glass.

Stay away from glass in windows and doors. Remain in assigned areas until advised to leave.
