





Fig.4 Fig. 2 16 in. Zinc Plates are shaded 4 ft.3 in.













Showing the Mean Vertical and Harizontal Motions of the Atmosphere in the case of a Homogenous Surface of the Earth in the two Polar Hemispheres.



AND ADJOINING TERRITORY





In 1872 Henry Wood Elliott, a voung artist-naturalist, travelled as a U.S. Treasury Department special agent to Alaska's Pribilof Islands, assigned to study the fur seals and to oversee the fur seal harvest. Since the United States government received substantial royalties from the trade in seal skins, Elliot's objective was to determine the most profitable manner of managing the great seal herds of the Pribilof Islands for a sustainable harvest. Earlier, in response to widespread seal slaughter and to protect its financial interests, the United



Henry Wood Elliott was one of the first Americans to study the northern fur seal. He worked vigorously on behalf of fur seal conservation.
