What's in a Name?

- Marine protected area: space in the ocean where human activities are more strictly regulated than the surrounding waters
- "Sanctuary" National Marine Sanctuaries Act
- "Monument" Antiquities Act (Presidential Proclamation)





Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument

- Established 2006
- World Heritage Site designation
 July 2010 (natural and cultural values)
- Unique features:
 - Protected species habitat & breeding area
 - Highest number of endemic marine species of any site in the world.

- 2015 Okeanos Explorer mapping and ROV work.










Mariana Trench Marine National Monument


- Established 2009
- 3 Units:
 - Mariana Trench/NWR (submerged lands only)
 - Volcanic Unit/Arc of Fire NWR (submerged lands only)
 - Islands Unit (waters & submerged lands)
- Unique geological and biological features



Mariana Trench Marine National Monument

- 2014 Research conducted by Schmidt Ocean Institute & PMEL
- 2015 Transfer to CNMI of submerged lands in Islands Unit out to 3nmi
- 2015 "Why do we Explore" teachers' workshop







Rose Atoll Marine National Monument

- Established 2009
- Unique features
 - 100 species of corals,
 - Large predator population and
 - 270 species of reef fish
 - Large populations of globally depleted giant clam.

Rose Atoll Marine National Monument

- 2012- Part of the National Marine Sanctuary of American Samoa.
- 2014 Google Streetview/Caitlin Seaview coming soon!
- Ongoing Green sea turtle research.
- 2015 Development of "gaps" management plan
- 2015 (TBD) Archipelago-wide science workshop.







The Pacific Remote Island Areas Marine National Monument

- Established in 2009, expanded in 2014.
 - Submerged lands and waters out to 50 nm at Palmyra, Kingman, Howland and Baker
 - Expansion area: submerged lands and waters out to US EEZ at Wake, Johnston, and Jarvis
- Unique features:
 - Near-pristine coral reefs
 - Significant historic and current U.S. military use.
 - Hui Panala'au

The Pacific Remote Island Areas Marine National Monument

- 2014 Cooperative Arrangement with Kiribati/Phoenix Islands Protected Area
- Ongoing International research activities
- 2015 Refocus on management planning process following completion of draft MT MP/EA
- 2015 Okeanos Explorer work at Johnston Atoll


