

FAI Certification Programs



FAI Certification Programs

FAI's Certification Program is based on OFPP Policy Letter 05-01 and include:

- •FAC-COTR, FAC-C, FAC-P/PM
- •Certifications may be obtained through training or fulfillment or a combination of both training and fulfillment, depending on the individuals' experience/training history
- •The FAC certifications apply to all executive civilian agencies, except those subject to the Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act (DAWIA)
- The FAC certification programs are decentralized and therefore administered by each civilian agency



FAC-COTR Certification Program

Certification for Contracting Officer Technical Representatives (FAC-COTR) is described in OMB issued memorandum dated November 26, 2007

- Establishes a structured training program for COTRs and other individuals performing these functions
- Minimum of 40 hours of training and must maintained
- Recommended five training modules for newly appointed COTRs (24 CLPs)
- Additional 18 CLPs of assignment specific training is needed to complete FAC-COTR certification (based on agency specific courses or learning events)
- Only one level



FAC-C Certification Program

The Federal Acquisition Certification in Contracting Program (FAC-C) is described in OMB issued memorandum dated January 20, 2006

- FAC-C has three levels (I, II, and III)
- At each FAC-C certification level, one must meet education, training, and experience requirements.
- Must complete specific DAU-equivalent training courses as well as meet certain hours of electives. In addition, must complete any agency specific courses.
- The certification is mandatory for all GS-1102s and other job series who have or need a warrant.
- To obtain the FAC-C, one must earn 80 (CLPs) in selected skills and earn 80 CLPs every two years to maintain certification

FAC-P/PM Certification Program

The Federal Acquisition Certification for Program and Project Managers (FAC-P/PM) is described in OMB issued memorandum dated April 25, 2007

- The FAC-P/PM certification program establishes the required competencies, training, and experience requirements for program and project
- FAC-P/PM has three levels (I, II, and III)
- The FAC-P/PM is not mandatory for all program and project managers; however, at a minimum, program and project managers assigned to programs considered major acquisitions must be senior-level certified unless a waiver is granted by the appropriate agency official
- To obtain the FAC-PPM, one must earn 80 (CLPs) in selected skills and earn 80 CLPs every two years to maintain certification Preparing Today's Workforce for Tomorrow's Challenges.



Certification Process and FAI's Role

Agency will manage the certification process

- Essential agency responsibilities for program administration are:
- identify and assess the acquisition workforce
- develop this workforce in accordance with the standards
- issue needed Certifications
- monitor continuous learning achievement

FAI will administer the program through issuance of guidance and dissemination of information

 Upon agency request, FAI will review existing agency programs against the requirements to identify the extent to which an agency's certification program meets the FAC guidelines


