PLAIN LANGUAGE

Vigorous writing is concise. A sentence should contain no unnecessary words, a paragraph no unnecessary sentences, for the same reason that a drawing should have no unnecessary lines and a machine no unnecessary parts. This requires not that the writer make all sentences short, or avoid all detail and treat subjects only in outline, but that every word tell.

- “Dumbing down”
- Stripping out necessary information
- Editorial polishing

LOGICAL ORGANIZATION



- State the purpose right away
- Get to the point quickly
If you could write only one sentence, what would it be?
- Anticipate the most important question and answer it immediately



Thank you for your letter on behalf of your constituent, Mr. Jim Smith, regarding the status of his application for a Limited Access General Category Individual Fishing Quota (LAGC IFQ) scallop permit for the fishing vessel *Big Jim*.

The LAGC IFQ permit was established by the New England Fishery Management Council through Amendment 11 to the Atlantic Sea Scallop Fishery Management Plan. In order to qualify for an LAGC IFQ permit, a vessel must meet two criteria: (1) the vessel must have been issued a federal scallop permit between March 1, 2000, and November 1, 2004; and (2) the vessel must have landed at least 1,000 pounds of scallop meats in any one year when the vessel also held a federal scallop permit.

The LAGC IFQ scallop permit regulations recognize a vessel's permit and fishing history, resulting in a vessel's qualification (rather than an individual's). The LAGC IFQ scallop permit program does not allow qualification for, or issuance of, a limited access permit to an individual, even if the individual demonstrated that they participated in a fishery or made landings on a vessel that they did not own.

Mr. Smith applied for an LAGC IFQ scallop permit May 16, 2008, and was denied the permit on June 16, 2008, because the vessel did not meet the qualification criteria.

LOGICAL ORGANIZATION

Be coherent

- *Limit each paragraph to one thought.*

Weigh the importance of every idea.

- *“Do they really need to know all this?”*

Use separate sentences and paragraphs for emphasis.

- *Isolate to strengthen.*



ISOLATE TO STRENGTHEN

The ocean, our coasts, and the Great Lakes are integral to who we are as a Nation, and are among our greatest assets. They feed us, support millions of jobs, and provide recreation. They are part of our communities and cultures, and enhance our national security by their mere presence. With 53 percent of our population living in coastal counties according to the most recent census, and that percentage expected to grow to 63 percent by 2020, the United States is a coastal nation. Our valuable ocean and coastal resources are vulnerable to misuse, and need to be thoughtfully managed to ensure they remain healthy and productive for current and future generations.

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Using Personal Pronouns

PRONOUNS



- Speak directly to readers and humanize your writing
- Make your writing relevant to readers
- Require less translation
- Eliminate wordiness



PRONOUNS

AVOID ACRONYMS



The Large Whale Take Reduction Team (~~LWTRT~~) will meet to discuss the Large Whale Take Reduction Plan (~~LWTRP~~). Once the ~~LWTRT~~ Team establishes criteria for the ~~LWTRP~~ Plan, they will report to stakeholders.





Active Voice

WHAT IS PASSIVE VOICE?

- The person doing the action usually follows the verb:

The recommendations were drafted by the Council chair.

- The verb has two parts: Some form of the verb “to be” plus another verb.

The remarks will be presented by the Assistant Administrator for Fisheries.



ACTIVE VOICE

Passive voice is wordy:

The application must be completed by the applicant and received by the financial office at the time designated by that office.

Active voice is concise:

We must receive your completed application by the deadline.

ACTIVE VOICE

Passive voice can disguise who did what:

Your letter was received yesterday.

Active voice makes it clear who did what:

We received your letter yesterday.



ACTIVE VOICE

Passive voice sounds awkward:

Consultation with respondents *was conducted* to determine the estimated burden.

Active voice sounds natural:

We consulted with respondents to determine the estimated burden.



AVOID “THERE IS” AND “THERE ARE”

These results are likely even ~~if there is no~~ without an influx of additional funds.

~~There are~~ Several methodologies ~~that~~ can be used to assess stock abundance.






Word Choice

WRITE WITH A WORD, NOT A PHRASE

- We repeated the comparison ~~in order to make sure~~ **to ensure** that the controls did not influence the results.
- Panels might be appropriate for reviewing issues that can be addressed ~~in relatively short periods of time~~ **quickly**.
- Managers may choose to simply ~~reduce the length of~~ **shorten** the fishing season.



AVOID REDUNDANT EXPRESSIONS

- The largest swordfish caught during the tournament weighed ~~a total of~~ 890 pounds.
- The cruise took place in ~~the month of~~ September.
- The recommendations include ~~but are not limited to~~ the following:

AVOID AMBIGUITY

- The dolphin arrived in critical condition. Because his brain was severely damaged, the veterinary surgeon decided to operate immediately.
- ✓ The dolphin arrived in critical condition with severe brain damage. The veterinary surgeon decided to operate immediately.



AVOID “IMPACT” AND “AFFECT” AS VERBS

- The policy will ~~affect the amount of~~ **increase** paperwork.
- These excess nutrients may ~~impact the~~ **quality of** **damage** coastal wetlands.

Easy-to-Read Format

FORMAT

- Use informative headings
- Write short sections
- Include only one issue per paragraph
- Use vertical lists
- Use white space, bold, and italics



LISTS

- Make it easy to identify all individual items or steps in a process.
- Add white space for easy reading.
- Help readers see the structure of the document.

PLAIN LANGUAGE

One unoriginal but useful tip: Write with a specific person in mind. When writing Berkshire Hathaway’s annual report, I pretend that I’m talking to my sisters. I have no trouble picturing them: Though highly intelligent, they are not experts in accounting or finance. They will understand plain English, but jargon may puzzle them. My goal is simply to give them the information I would wish them to supply me if our positions were reversed. To succeed, I don’t need to be Shakespeare; I must, though, have a sincere desire to inform.
