EXHIBITIONS

Exhibitions explore Texas history and the state's relationship to the world. Did you know Spain and France once claimed the region, and Texas was part of Mexico? History, science, technology, and culture are all examined through a robust schedule of vibrant special exhibitions. In 2016 and 2017, the Museum will host exhibitions that explore the farm-to-table movement, Nazi propaganda, the history of music festivals, Stevie Ray Vaughan, and prohibition — before and after alcohol was legalized.



TEXAS HISTORY GALLERIES

The Texas History Galleries feature an incredible diversity of 500 ever-changing artifacts. From the first inhabitants to 21st century space exploration, rare artifacts convey the successes, struggles, and innovations of Texans. The Museum is also the permanent home of the 300-year-old French shipwreck *La Belle*, featured in an exhibition that includes the extraordinary remains of the ship's hull and cargo while highlighting the excavation and conservation process.

A DESTINATION FOR FILM

Enjoy the very best cinematic experience in the all-digital, state-of-the-art IMAX® Theatre, which is home to the biggest screen in Texas — six stories tall. Crystal clear, lifelike images and acoustically tuned full-spectrum sound are so all-encompassing that you're part of the action. The IMAX Theatre offers daily screenings of both award-winning documentaries and feature films.

The Texas Spirit Theater is one of the most beautiful film experiences in Austin. This special-effects space immerses visitors in the film with crackling lightning, pounding rain, and a few other fun surprises. Texas is a part of film history and continues to be a hub of talent and creativity. The film program includes daily screenings of the Museum's signature films and scheduled programming like the Texas Focus Series, Giant Screen Classics, premieres, and special features.
