TEMPORARY INJUNCTION – Revised 09/05/2013

I. Prior to the commencement of an action, to obtain a temporary injunction, the following documents must be submitted. If the case is e-filable, these documents must be filed electronically with the court in accordance with the E-Services Procedures and Technical Standards.

A. Documents Required for an Ex Parte Temporary Injunction

1. Application for Temporary Injunction

Note: <u>Section 11-9 of the Connecticut Practice Book</u> requires that the application contain a disclosure of any previous application that has been made for the same order or injunction.

- 2. Verified complaint or affidavit (Section 52-473 of the Connecticut General Statutes)
- 3. Order to show cause and Summons for hearing
- 4. Proposed bond with surety, if required OR a request that no bond be required for good cause shown (Section 52-472 of the Connecticut General Statutes)

Note: If you are filing the original bond, include a self-addressed stamped envelope with the bond so that it will be returned to you. <u>E-Services Procedures and Technical</u>

- 5. Order of service
- 6. Proposed order for injunction (If you are seeking an ex parte injunction (decided on the application of one party only), you may write the order in the alternative in the event that the judge requires a hearing.)
- 7. Certification regarding notice to each opposing party (Section 4-5 of the Connecticut Practice Book)
- 8. The entry fee is \$350.

B. Documents Required for a Temporary Injunction After Notice and Hearing

- 1. Application for Temporary Injunction after hearing
- 2. Verified complaint or affidavit (Section 52-473 of the Connecticut General Statutes)
- 3. Order to show cause and Summons for hearing
- 4. Proposed Bond with surety, if required OR a request that no bond be required for good cause shown (Section 52-472 of the Connecticut General Statutes)

Note: If you are filing the original bond, include a self-addressed stamped envelope with the bond so that it will be returned to you. <u>E-Services Procedures and Technical</u>
Standards

5. The entry fee is \$350.

II. Once an action has been commenced and a docket number assigned, a motion for a temporary injunction may be filed. It will be heard when it appears on the calendar. If the case is e-filable, the motion must be filed electronically with the court in accordance with the <u>E-Services</u> Procedures and Technical Standards.

Note: It is the responsibility of counsel to complete service according to Section 10-12 (c) of the Connecticut Practice Book and Section 10-13 of the Connecticut Practice Book.
