# **Committee and Board roles/responsibilities**

Payment model monitoring committee	<ul> <li>Define vision and core principles for payment model design</li> <li>Identify options for payment design consistent with these principles</li> <li>Identify approaches to funding delivery system transformation</li> <li>Monitor and report on the implementation and rollout of new payment models</li> </ul>
Clinical committee	<ul> <li>Convene stakeholders to define priorities for delivery system transformation</li> <li>Recommend measures for common provider scorecard</li> <li>Define and launch shared resources and services, including clinical guidelines/protocols (e.g., for care coordination)</li> </ul>
Patient/Con- sumer advisory committee	<ul> <li>Develop recommendations for patient/consumer engagement tools and campaigns</li> <li>Represent patient/consumer voice in stakeholder sessions</li> </ul>
Workforce and education committee	<ul> <li>Coordinate education programs and workforce symposia</li> <li>Continue to identify education and training priorities for Delaware workforce</li> <li>Promote Delaware as a "Learning State"</li> </ul>
Healthy Neighborhoods Committee	<ul> <li>Identify goals for Healthy Neighborhoods and select Neighborhoods for funding</li> <li>Monitor progress of Healthy Neighborhoods and provide technical assistance</li> <li>Coordinate with Division of Public Health</li> </ul>
Board	<ul> <li>Review committee recommendations and recommend them to stakeholders</li> <li>Set measures to track and monitor implementation</li> <li>Recommend policy support from HCC if needed</li> <li>Ensure continued open, transparent, participatory process</li> </ul>
	Committees will include Board member(s), additional standing members appointed by Board, and advisory groups if needed

### **Innovation Center Board overview – DRAFT**

Overview <ul> <li>Board members must be knowledgeable about delivery, reimbursement, a regulation of health care services, community health, patient engagement health education, or as a health consumer         </li> </ul> Board should include at least the following members <ul> <li>One member of patient or consumer groups</li> </ul>	
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<ul> <li>Two practicing physicians*</li> <li>One practicing non-physician clinician</li> <li>Chair of the Health Care Commission</li> <li>Two members with expertise in hospital/health system administrat</li> <li>Secretary of the Department of Health and Social Services</li> <li>One member with expertise in payer administration</li> <li>One member with experience in administration of a community health</li> <li>One member involved in purchasing health care coverage for employe</li> <li>Director of the Office of Management and Budget</li> <li>One representative of an institution of higher education</li> <li>Two at-large members*</li> <li>Non-voting Directors</li> <li>The Executive Director of the Innovation Center</li> <li>The CEO of the DHIN</li> </ul>	provider

# **Role of Innovation Center Board members**

General responsibilities	<ul> <li>Serve as members of Board and at least one Committee</li> <li>Offer expertise and ensure an inclusive and participatory process</li> <li>Review and approve work of each committee, ensuring consistency with overall guiding principles</li> <li>Communicate expectations for the adoption of committee work across health care community</li> <li>Identify measures to track implementation and propose any action needed to address variation versus expectations</li> </ul>
Commitment	<ul> <li>Board: likely meet quarterly (over time), with monthly 2 hour meetings for the first 6-12 months</li> <li>Committees: likely meet monthly (interim check-ins with Chair)</li> <li>Board members nominated to staggered terms so 1/3 of Board is up for renewal each year</li> </ul>

# **Selection approach – initial**

#### **Process**

- Appoint a sub-committee of HCC to evaluate candidates for
  - Expertise
  - Ability to commit time
  - Overall complementary skillsets on Board
- Sub-committee will recommend full list of initial Board members to HCC
- Reminder: over time, a nominating committee will be established to review/nominate new board members

Innovation Center	<ul> <li>Submit recommendations for the Board by April 14</li> <li>Sub-committee will evaluate and recommend by May 1</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Stand up the Board by July 1</li> </ul>
Grant	Expect application to come out soon
preparation	<ul> <li>Currently preparing, building from work in SHIP and ongoing across workstreams</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Once announced, expect timeline to be very short, may reach out individually for support and feedback as well as for letters of support</li> </ul>
Updates	<ul> <li>Will continue to advocate and communicate about SIM work across Delaware and nationally</li> </ul>
	HCC will continue as regular forum for updates as well
